Our group met on Wednesday, February 17th via ZOOM, due to the dangerous weather conditions. There were 17 of us present at the meeting. Following our flag salute's, the secretary and treasurer both gave their reports, which were approved.

For our inspiration this month, our President, Jan Beattie, presented, via her Quick Tips, how to use voter registration through the years to find a lost ancestor. This is especially helpful during the 1890's when we are missing a national census. That Quick Tip can be found on our website.

Our speaker this month was Andrea Moon, who spoke on "The Wonders of DNA". Following the death of her mother, Andrea found a box of old letters and some information in those letters led her to reach out to her father, a man she had had no contact with for most of her life. That attempt was unsuccessful, but Andrea did not give up and was finally able, through DNA, to find other relatives. Some of these relatives were people she had never heard of, which increased her curiosity. Her DNA also revealed that she was part Italian which was a surprise. Going back to those old letters, Andrea found someone who could translate them from Greek to English, only to learn that the man she had thought was her father actually wasn't. Through a series of perfectly

timed events, over seven years, Andrea was able to discover her true father's name and a whole new family. It reminded us all that persistence and determination are necessary in family research.
