Women like Calamity Jane and Annie Oakley, who were sharp shooters and appeared in Buffalo Bill's Wild West Show. Altogether Jan spoke of 19 women with names like Big Nose Kate, Stagecoach Mary Fields, Rose of Cimarron Dunn and her own relative, Mustang Sally Scull. These women led dangerous, adventurous lives mingling with the outlaws of their day, often in brothels, and facing the hardships and hard choices of a single woman in the 1800's. Some died young, some just disappeared leaving no record of what happened to them and some lived to their golden years, having left that wild life and moved into the life of a respectable citizen.






MODERN HOMEMAKERS AT HARVEST FEST

Cultural Enrichment Poster Contest

The State Cultural Enrichment Committee is promoting an annual poster contest that highlights points of interest in local counties.

Guidelines for the contest:

- 1. This will be a group OHCE project rather than an individual. Local OHCE groups will submit one poster per organization. Each county shall decide on one poster to <u>take to District</u> <u>meeting</u> for judging.
- 2. OHCE groups will decide on a location of interest in their county and portray this in a poster format. Size of posterboard will be 11in. X 14in. At least 3 types of medium ex: paint, drawing, photo, cut and paste should be used.
- 3. The poster will be accompanied by a blank Oklahoma map with location of your county and site marked.
- 4. A half-page description of the site (minimum 500 words) will also be attached to the poster. The written description should include site location, reasons for choosing the site, any historical data, etc. It should be typed and formatted for easy viewing from a short distance.
- 5. Posters will be taken by a designated person, such as the Educator, to the District Meetings. Posters will be displayed and judged at the district meetings.
- 6. The first-place winners of the district meetings will be displayed and judged at the annual state conference. The posters will be collected by the Cultural Enrichment Committee Representative who will take to State Conference for display and judging.
- 7. Prizes will be awarded for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd in District with first place poster being entered at the state level. Gift Certificate Prizes will be awarded.
- 8. Prizes will be given to 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place winners at state conference. Prizes will be \$30, \$20, and \$10

Master Sewing Volunteer State Training Workshop April 27-28, 2023

Cleveland County Fairgrounds, Norman, OK

If you are interested in using your sewing skills to assist your County Extension FCS Educator with local programs related to sewing, consider this opportunity to become a Master Sewing Volunteer (MSV) by attending the state training on April 27-28, 2023. Registration will be limited.

First Steps:

- Be a Certified Master FCS Volunteer* or be a Certified 4-H Volunteer who has completed the required FCS modules.
- Ask your County FCS Educator for an application form.
- Work with your county educator to set up a time for a personal visit to discuss expectations of the program.
- Bring a sewing sample with you to your personal visit.
- Your FCS Educator must submit the names of qualified applicants to the state office by January 13, 2023.

If more than 30 names are received, state staff will randomly draw 30 names. A short waiting list will also be drawn in the case of cancellations.

Workshop details for the 30 selected individuals:

- Bring your own sewing machine and basic sewing kit to the training.
- The classroom at the Cleveland County Fairgrounds will be open for machine set up on April 26, 3-5pm or you can wait until the morning of April 27.
- Expect to stay until 4 pm each day.
- Registration fee is \$20 which includes lunch on April 27 and 28.
- You are responsible for your own lodging arrangements.
- You will receive an email asking you to complete a background check through Sterling Volunteers. This is a requirement as MSVs will be expected to work with youth.

- Checks must be received in the state FCS office by February 17, 2023.
- Individuals who complete the workshop and meet all qualifications will also be asked to donate at least 20 hours of their time to the County Extension Office in the year following the training.

Individuals who complete the workshop and meet all qualifications will receive the following:

- Certificate of Completion
- Flash drive with class materials,
- 3-ring binder for sample pieces
- An apron with the Master Sewing Volunteer logo to wear when teaching workshops.




